Our Tenth Birthday Celebration at Jenolan Caves, October 1982

With our club speeding towards its 50th milestone next year I thought I would share with you one of the most enjoyable car club events we have attended.

It was the 10th Birthday Celebration at Jenolan Caves on 2nd-4th October 1982, commemorating the formation of the YOUNG VETERAN VINTAGE AND POST VINTAGE MOTOR CLUB (YVV&PV Motor Club) on 29th November 1972.

The bookings for 60 adults and 27 children for 2 nights was finalised a year prior: 'first class accommodation, guaranteed to be the best, the meals are always 3 course at least, and all inclusive. Costs vary between \$75 -\$100 per person per day depending on what type of room. Children under 12 will be half-price...'

Members from Young district had great fun travelling down on Saturday 2nd October departing from the Police Boys' Club in a spread-out convoy starting at 7.45a.m., stopping for a picnic lunch together at a park in Kelso, a "cuppa", or to give advice when someone broke down (and there were several breakdowns!) The most remarkable repair occurred when Col Harmer's DODGE "ground to a halt", needing a new condenser - Despite nearly 2 hours of hot air and unsuccessful mechanical expertise, John Collins arrived, somehow had the necessary part under his seat, and the repair was miraculously completed in less than five minutes!!! Tom set a steady pace driving at 30 MPH the whole trip, about 175 miles there (plus return), to run in his ten-year restoration, the MOON. We followed Jim and now and again Garry had fun catching up to him.

All arrived safely at the caves before sundown in plenty of time for dinner, looking forward to all it had to offer. We enjoyed cave viewings and bush walks on Sunday and the celebration dinner with us dressing up in any vintage costume, followed by the cake-cutting and me in 1920's attire playing the piano for a singalong. Each members (or couple) attending received a commemorative beer mug, hand-made and engraved by the renowned Helmut Heible from Murringo, and a car-badge. The fellowship and atmosphere was special. The Caves House had not been refurbished then, and I remember some of us had private rooms facilities, whilst other guests may or may not have had a hand-basin in the corner, and walked to the bathroom... the furniture was all old-style.... how crisp and fresh the air was, and how the stars twinkled on our evening stroll.... I expect the accessibility in the caves would have improved by now too, as there were a few difficult vertical ladders and lots of steps in the cave we chose to tour....

The event was well supported with 78 finally coming (53 adults). Allan and Margaret Haggerty and 3 children Amelia, Christopher and Nicholas came from Griffith; Keith and Cheryl Wheeler plus children Catherine, David, Andrew and Amanda from Lockhart; Michael and Gwen Livingstone and 3 children Patrick, Amanda and Sharon, and John and Joan Collins and his daughter Melissa from Cootamundra; Bob and Sylvia Franks from Yass; Ron and Mrs Maslin from Temora; and from Cowra Ross Hogan and his wife Jean and Bernie and Helen Finlay with baby Paula decked out in a cane pram and "puff" quilt (their Morris Oxford didn't make it). As well, Les Sonter, Ian Harris and Norm Williams and families and Russell and Betty Cope joined us from Sydney. Locals were: President Tom and Secretary Margaret Pestell, Treasurer Col, Jenny, Geoffrey and Jo-Anne Harmer; Club Captain Cam and Helen Thackeray, Reg and Jan Johnson with Douglas, Matthew and Kellie, Eric and Rowie Griffiths and children Julie and Evan, Ted and Gwen Brown; Keith Brown and Ted Tame, Kevin and Maisie White, Colin and Eileen Kerr; Alan and Ruth Foster; Iris Adams and her sons Michael and John; John, Joyce, Bridget and Charlotte Cavanagh; Gail Hanigan, Jim, Geoff, Margaret and Rachael Charlesworth; Garry and I. (Reg, Eric, Bernie, Garry, Ross, and Iris were the events committee that year, also Claude Marsh, who was unable to attend).

Garry remembers lots of fun. He and the Cavanagh girls short-sheet Joyce and John's bed while I watched, and then the little girl Harmer wanted him to do her mother and father's bed too, but Garry said "I don't think so", as he didn't know them very well then and didn't know how they'd take it. Joyce went to bed first and discovered the trick and thought it was great fun, and waited, with legs bent up, for John to come and get caught, and couldn't believe how long it took him to get ready for bed!!! Jenny recalls some fellows even told tales of "Yowies" and jumped out from bushes trying to give a few children a thrill!

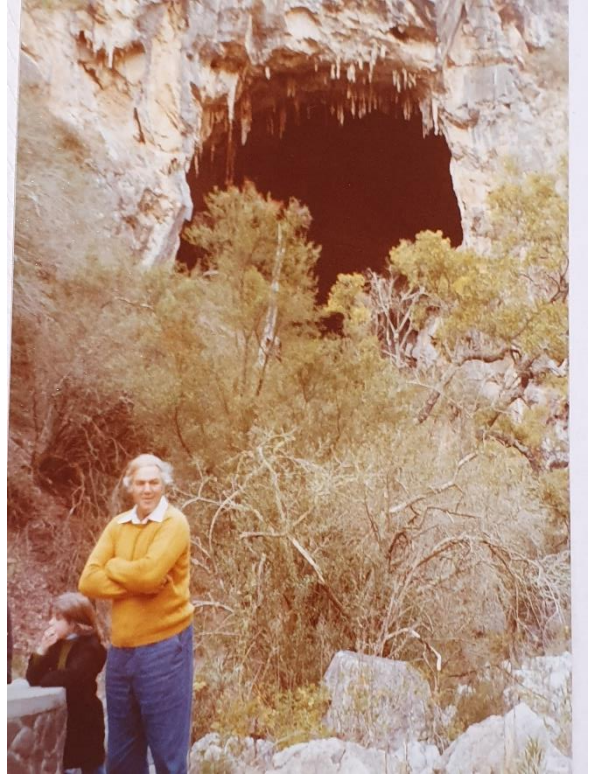

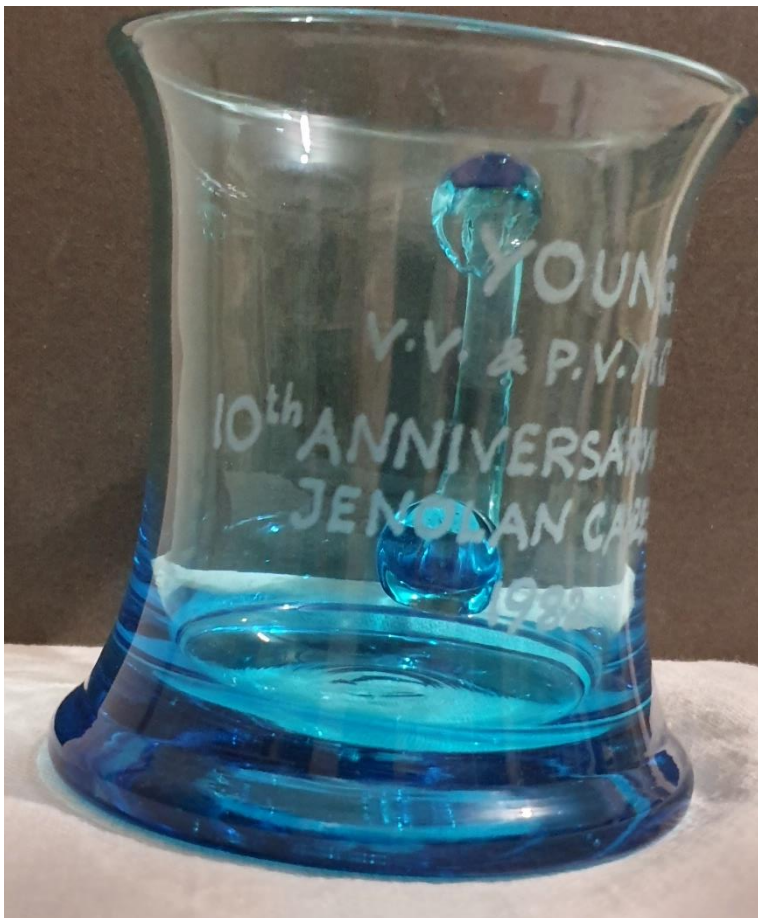
